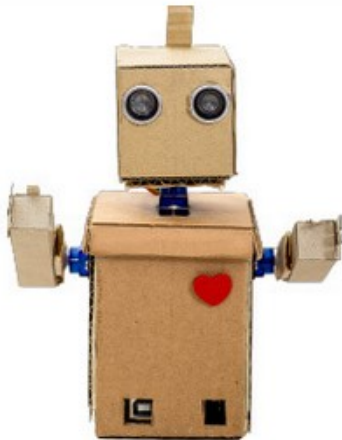


What is a Cardboard Challenge?

A Cardboard Challenge is an opportunity for children to build whatever they can dream up using cardboard, recycled materials, and imagination. The Global Cardboard Challenge was inspired by the short film, *Caine's Arcade*, about a 9-year-old boy who spent his summer vacation building an elaborate cardboard arcade inside his dad's Los Angeles auto parts shop. When is Lawton's Cardboard Challenge?

Cardboard Challenge is optional and starts now! You can begin planning and building your creation right away. Students who choose to participate should plan to bring their creations to school on Friday, March 18th or upload a picture to their Seesaw journal.



How Does it Work?

Students may work alone or with their family and friends to design and build cardboard constructions fitting into one of the following categories:

- Games
- Architecture
- Space

Be resourceful by using materials you can gather from home, work, and school. All constructions should be made from clean recycled/repurposed materials.
